
### Mission Statement :

## Executive Summary

It is indeed a matter of pride and privilege to present before you 13th annual report and share my feelings and ideas with you. Shubh Dipavali Greetings from SanjivaniPariwar in advance.

As you all know a small initiative of helping poor flood affected villagers and providing primary medical care in 2005 has now grown up to a full-fledged NGO with established credibility, transparency, commitment, a symbol of dedication, devotion & passion aided with selfless services of Doctors ,volunteers and support Staff across all projects. Flow of donations all throughout the journey of 13 years has infused energy to team Sanjivani to take up different tasks for upliftment of society.

As we went on adding one service after another more and more need we observed in the community of adding another service, and thus evolved spectrum of service right from—

### Medical Activities -

#### Primary Health Care to Rural-Urban Population-

- Mobile medical Van
- Urban Medical Clinic
- Dental Van
- Ophthalmic Van
- Mobile Tele Medicine Van
- Mobile Pathology Service



Every month on an average 13,000 patients are benefited under our rural health program and are getting medicines at just Rs.10/- for 15 days,getting blood pressure and Diabetes checked at just Rs.10/- and average 7000 patients of B.P/Diabetes are getting treatment at just Rs.20/- for 15 days.

**Flood Relief Work** - Rapid action support work to flood affected population-last year our team had done good work for flood affected population of Banaskantha, and this year we have been working for Kerala disaster.

#### SecondaryReferral Medical Services in form of -

**Sanjivani Arogya Kendra (Urban)**- A fully equipped O.P.D. based diagnostic centre, where at present on an average 150 patients are getting facility of investigations, medical advice and benefit of generic medical store.

**Used Clothes donation program**- With the support from well wishers in Raleigh USA under the banner of **VYO ( Vallabh Youth Organisation) shri Arvindbhai Shah** has been sending about 20 tons of used clothes collected from NRI of USA. We have been distributing these clothes to poor and under privileged people of different villages and hospitals

free of cost without discretion of caste, creed, race or religion. We are thankful to donors abroad for continuing this support. We also thank **Suresh M. Shah** who has taken up total responsibility of procurement and distribution of used clothes.

In Ahmedabad also people and one NGO **Adarsh Ahmedabad** has been continuously giving support by donating used clothes. This small initiative has proved of immense value to underprivileged beneficiaries

#### **Education Activities-**

Education initiative with a basic idea of providing education enriched with technology to underprivileged children at no extra financial Burdon on parents. The volume of work executed by team Sanjivani itself speaks of commitment to the task.

In 2018-19 we have 910 Students at our Shiv Shala Complex having KG to Std 10 in Gujarati and KG to std 5 in Eng Medium. The first batch of std 10 scored 88% result.

We have observed that for overall development of any community and inclusive growth education and health are basic needs. You will get detailed overview of all activities in various projects from work report in next few pages. We sincerely express our feeling of gratitude to all Donors who have supported all throughout the journey of 13 years, which we feel we have completed with great success and consistency. We are really thankful to you all for trust you expressed in our team and empowered us to extend the help to population at need.

I am proud to say that all Doctors, paid staff and volunteers **have worked 360 days a year** tirelessly to enrich our satisfaction of being instrumental in extending helping hand to underprivileged community.

**Our appeal is to donate time, skill, wisdom, experience, intelligence and money for upliftment of society and make India a just country with equality, opportunity for all.**

#### **Challenges faced by nation at large to-day are -**

- Population, Poverty ,Illiteracy, Anaemia-Malnutrition added by
- Alarmingly increasing incidence of NCD (Hypertension, Diabetes , Kidney Diseases, Cancer and mental stress related disorders)
- Increasing cost of living beyond rise in earnings.

- Deteriorating level of education in community schools.
- Commercialization of health and education services making difficult access to these institutes for low income population.

As you all know development of Health and Education services in Rural Areas is not to the mark. Majority of Hospitals, Doctors are located in Cities and are cost prohibitive, so that only affording people or one with some sort of Medclaim or reimbursement can think of going to these services.

Trend of Urbanization has led to situation that 30% people live in cities but still 70% live in underserved villages. Rapid rise in flow toward cities has led to explosive growth of unorganized slums around all cities, where in people live in ill ventilated overcrowded huts exposing them to communicable diseases.

Poverty, Environmental Pollution, faulty diet, increasing sedentary job situations, long hours on computers, increasing stress levels in people has led to generation of Non Communicable diseases like Diabetes and Hypertension, Cancer etc. Struggle of existence faced by underprivileged people has no time to think for preventive strategy to this emerging epidemic of Diabetes and Hypertension and are unaware of future complications mortality and morbidity associated with them, which are going to create tremendous pressure on economy of an individual as well as national.

#### Our upcoming projects-

##### E-learning Donation Program -

Sanjivani also had observed marked improvement in scholastic performance of underprivileged children at our school by providing education aided with technology, taking care of their health and nutrition. Motivated by these encouraging results Sanjivani has taken initiative in field of education by providing technological and infrastructural support to schools with limited resources. We are sure E-learning project undertaken by our team will surely improve quality of education. So far with financial support of enlightened donors like you team Sanjivani has given such support to 28 schools.

##### Women Empowerment -

Sanjivani strongly believes that women empowerment is another area to be addressed. In all activities of Sanjivani supported projects maximum employment is given to females. As you know we have started project “**Sanjivani Surksha**” - Sterile Sanitary pad project from Jan -16. So far we have manufactured more than 6 lakh pads and distributed 5,50,000 of them to underprivileged rural beneficiaries, at most affordable rates or even free to school and college girls, ladies in childbearing age in villages so as to improve their hygiene level during menstrual cycles. This will reduce infection rate in genital organs, pelvic infections and will help reducing infertility, treatment of which is beyond capacity of poor families. This will not only improve health and hygiene of females but will also provide job in manufacturing and marketing of Sanjivani Suraksha Pads.

##### Adolescent Health Counselling -

Over the years we have observed sharp increase in prevalence of NCD's like HBP, Diabetes, Heart and Kidney Diseases and Cancer. We have been working tirelessly for early detection and treatment of Diabetes and Hypertension as it is the key to better management of diseases as well for prevention of future complications.

But what next once we stamp any person to be Diabetic or Hypertensive? Is it curable? Is it possible to get results so far behaviour change is concerned in population at large after 40's?

Keeping in mind prevention strategy for these dreaded diseases, team Sanjvani has started this Adolescent Health counselling program especially for students of high schools.

Our main focus here is to educate them for-

- Definition of Health-Physical and Mental
- Role and components of Balanced Diet-Healthy and Junk foods
- Role of Proteins, Fruits, Green Leafy Vegetables in diet.
- Role of Physical exercise, yoga in day to day life to maintain fitness
- Something about attention, concentration, memory, intelligence-How to improve it.
- Stages of adolescence-early, mid and late –Physical and mental changes during this phases.
- To set goal and work hard to achieve that goal.

Our vision behind this initiative is that, if girl is educated she is going to handle kitchen once she marry. If she is not anaemic at the time of delivery maternal mortality and infant mortality will go down. Healthy baby also will not be prone to NCD's. Collectively this small initiative will see results after 20 years by achieving overall improvement in Mental and Physical health.

#### **Rain Water Harvesting Project -**

As we all know day by day effect of global warming is seen across the world. Water levels are constantly receding. If not addressed in time we are going to face drastic challenge of scarcity of water. With a view to conserve rain water by recharging soil, we have started this project. With minimum expenditure we have developed two models which are known since ages.

1. To connect terrace rain water drains to a failed borewell
2. To construct underground percolation well to be connected to catchment pit at a place of natural outflow gradient.

This year we have implemented these both modules at our school and are working excellently. We are desirous to help schools to implement the same in coming years.

We request all charity minded people to distribute fruits, chikis, pulses instead of Sweets and high calorie inputs to Old age homes and children as and when they wish to do so.

Let's join hands to help the real needy. If everyone spends just 1% of his/her income for welfare of underserved people, we feel no one will remain undernourished or illiterate in the country.

## Organisational Report of Activity

Respected Well-wishers of Sanjivani,

It is indeed a pleasure to present before you the activity report of Sanjivani health and relief committee for the year ended 2017-18.

As you know team Sanjivani has constantly launched a program after program addressing the basic need of a common man. Many of the projects implemented in these 13 years have been first of its kind by any NGO across Gujarat. To name a few-

- Mobile Medical van
- Urban Sanjivani Clinic
- Mobile Dental Van
- Mobile Ophthalmic van
- Mobile Telemedicine van
- Mobile Pathology Laboratory etc.



to address the need of underprivileged-underserved community across three districts of Gujarat namely Ahmedabad, Kheda and Gandhinagar in radius of 60 Kilometres from Ahmedabad.

### Our focused area has been-

#### Health Care -

Sanjivani Gramin Arogya Kendra – Primary Care  
Sanjivani Health Care Centre -Sec. Ref. Centre

#### Women empowerment -

Sanjivani Suraksha-Sanitary Napkin Project

#### Education -

Having a school in Ahmedabad, managed by Padmavati Education Trust –headed by trustees of Sanjivani Health and Relief Committee

The year started with the flood relief work in Banaskantha district of North Gujarat. Our team had treated 1300 patients in 9 villages badly affected by flood over three days. Our team also had distributed food grain kits-15kgs each- to address need of a family for 10 days to 600 families. 1100 children in these villages were given school bags with compass and stationery. All these had been possible through small donations from more

than 150 donors in response to a social media call ( WhatsApp) to support the suffering humanity.

This year we have added two more projects to prevent Indian youth becoming victims of malnutrition, ignorance about non communicable diseases like Hypertension, Diabetes and Cancer etc. The projects are as follows:

**Adolescent Health Counselling :**

Since March our team has started addressing adolescent youth between age of 9 to 18 years studying in primary and secondary schools. Our team has so far addressed 110 schools targeting both urban and rural students and have educated more than 17000 students followed by free sanitary pads distribution to more than 13000 girls.

**Rain water Harvesting Program:**

Due to effects of global warming the ground water levels are receding day by day and if not addressed in time the nation is going to face a major water scarcity challenge. To address the same we have implemented above program at our schoole and happy to inform that 95% of the rain water in school premises is sent back to earth to recharge the soil.

**E learning Donation Program :** We have observed over two years at our school that education by audio visual media has been instrumental in improving attention, concentration , understanding and overall scholastic performance of children. In rural areas and in schools run by non-granted trusts in periphery of Ahmedabad and in remote villages where number and quality of teachers are not up to the mark, if such facility is provided to selected schools on need basis, we can improve the scenario in education remarkably at minimum cost. Our team has so far with the support of enlightened donors have succeeded in providing such facility to 28 schools mentioned below: (See Table -1)

**Supporting small scale NGOs to help in their education and health programs:**

This year we came across a small NGO in tribal belt of Dang district in village Jamanpada, Taluko: Waghai where we have taken up a mission to support them constructing a boarding school for the benefit of tribal children. With the support of enlightened donors we have been able to support a small trust “Dream High Charitable Trust” to construct a school. So far construction work up to slab level has been completed and expected to be over by next term. We are providing facility to accommodate 250 students at present.

### 1. Rural primary Health Care Facility:-

- A. Mobile Medical Clinic – covering 10 villages daily, every fortnightly. Every month on an average 14000 patients are taking benefit at Sanjivani Gramin Arogya Kendra across three districts of Gujarat on regular basis.
- B. Mobile Dental and Ophthalmic van – working on every Sunday
- C. Mobile Telemedicine van providing ECG facility at grass root village level. Without shifting the patient we are providing ECG reported by consultant in less than 15 minutes. Nearly 3500 ECGs are taken in villages this year.

- D. Mobile Pathology Laboratory -daily service to different village in prescheduled manner. It is a novel project of providing basic Bio-Chemistry reports like Kidney function tests, Liver function tests, Lipid profile, Uric Acid, Haemoglobin estimation etc. at token rate. This project has been instrumental in creating awareness in patients regarding need of regular check-up to prevent major complications associated with Diabetes and Hypertension in later life.

- E. Project Diabetes/Hypertension: Of 13000 patients taking treatment every month at Sanjivani Rural Arogya Kendra about 6000-7000 patients belong to these diseases, taking regular treatment every month. We are happy to inform you all that patients taking treatment for Diabetes, Hypertension since years is a direct evidence of success that there has not been an emergency situation to get hospitalized for these patients. We have been able to generate mass awareness for Diabetes and Hypertension and have motivated for preventive health care approach. Our initiative for yoga training has been instrumental in motivating people for healthy life style, through non pharmacological means.

**Sanjivani Arogya Kendra** – (Urban) in the name of **Madhuben J. Patel** has also been instrumental in providing primary health care services to urban community. On an average 40 patients are taking treatment daily at this centre operated between 2 to 5 pm. Here facility of thyroid function test is provided on every Friday at token price and Juvenile patients of Diabetes are provided all facilities including glucometer, blood sugar strips, insulin vial, syringes and all required supporting medicines at negligible price to make them compliant to treatment.

### Secondary Referral Centre “ Sanjivani Health Care Centre”

As you know, we have started this centre with a financial support from Jewalex India group, Mumbai. Month after month and year after year number of beneficiary patients is on rise and at present average 150 patients are taking advantage of various faculty consultants and investigation services like Radiology and Pathology. Our generic medical store is providing medicines at most economical rate which poorest of poor can afford.

Sadhu saints of all religion are provided free services at the centre and poor patients are given sizable discount in our charges as the need may be. We are happy that all throughout three years since 2015 the revenue losses we have made have been donated by Jewelex India, Mumbai. This centre is managed by Dr. Asit I. Dave

This year we have added more faculties like Gastroenterologist, Cardiologist, Nephrologist, Ortho-dentist, Maxilo-facial surgeon, Peditontist and Pulmonologist at our centre at subsidized rates. Now modern treatment like tooth implant and bracing for irregular teeth is also available at our centre. Now Lung function list (PFT) is also made available.

Needy patients requiring further hospitalization or investigations for major illnesses are referred to network hospitals and are given sizable financial support for investigation like coronary angiography.

### Education Project :

Under the education project of Sanjivani Health and Relief Committee, various programs have been taken up.

1. Shri Pravinbhai Shantilal Kothari (Jewelex India, Mumbai)

Shiv Prathmik - Madhyamik Shala and Sanjivani Vidhyavihar

(Gujarati Medium-KG to Std.10) ( English Medium-KG to Std. 5)

In the year 2017-18 we had 774 students and first batch appearing board exams of std. 10. We are happy to inform you that the first batch of Std. 10 comprising of 35 students scored 88% result with continuous effort of students and teachers. We had four students of whom three are girls scored more than 90 percentile and the first scored 99.25 percentile. The result itself showcases the efforts put in by our dedicated teachers and continuous monitoring by trustees.

Over and above scholastic activity attention was focused on culture values, Yoga, nutrition, medical health ( Eye Check-up, dental check-up) and growth assessment.

**Midday Snacks Project** under CSR budget of GRUH Finance Limited: With the continued support over three years from GRUH Finance Limited-Ahmedabad, students are provided high protein variety snacks freshly prepared on daily basis under close supervision of our program co-ordinator Atul K.Patel. Special high protein snacks after prior health check-up were provided by Jewelex India, Mumbai throughout the year and also for coming academic year 2018-19.

**E learning Program:** The soft skill education by audio-visual media, under e-learning project of Sanjivani have been provided to the students with support from **Shri Jitubhai Shah** Jewelex Group-Belgium who has given financial support for consecutive three years. We take opportunity to inform you again that at our school we have central computer lab connected to server having 51 computers, 5 smart classes with projector and screen and second computer lab with 15 computers where each students is given on hand working opportunity.

**Solar rooftop project : Smt. Kokilaben Manubhai Patel** donated for this project and we have been able to install the same this year as an initiative to go green.

As we have done last year, this year also we have provided one pair of uniform, shoes to all students free of cost with support of donors. Notebooks and exercise books are also provided free and support education material at highly discounted rate as an effort to provide quality education without financial burden on parents.

**Freeship and scholarship program :** With financial support from donors like Jewelex India, Mumbai, Shah Investors' Home Ltd- Ahmedabad, ShriNishitbhai Kothari-Jewelex DMCC Dubai and many individual donors we have been able to give freeship and scholarship to nearly 200 students last year as well as in coming academic year too.
